Visitor Center open daily, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Enjoy the 10 mile trail system at Ottawa National Wildlife Refuge, including the brand new boardwalk behind the Visitor Center. The birding is guaranteed to be spectacular! Waterfowl, warblers, and other birds abound throughout our marshes, scrub/shrub, and wooded habitat. Refuge visitors can stop in at the Visitor Center and learn more about the Lake Erie marshes, wildlife and migration, the history of the refuge, and more.



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Ottawa National Wildlife Refuge, established in 1961, is managed to provide diverse habitat for waterfowl, shorebirds, neotropical migrant songbirds and other animal and plant species. The Refuge was declared an Important Bird Area by the American Bird Conservancy and the Lake Erie Marshes, including the Ottawa Complex, were designated a Regional Shorebird Reserve in the Western Hemisphere Shorebird Reserve Network.

27.7 mi – approximately 34 minutes

- **Holiday Inn Perrysburg-French Quarter, 10621 Fremont Pike, Perrysburg, OH 43551**
 1. Start out going SOUTHEAST on FREMONT PIKE/ US-20 E/ US-23 S toward CARRONADE DR.
 2. Turn LEFT onto ROCKY RD/ OH-163.
 3. Turn RIGHT onto GENOA RD/ OH-163. Continue to follow OH-163.
 4. Turn LEFT onto OH-590.
 5. Turn RIGHT onto OH-2.
